Child & Youth Intensive Group Facilitator

- Support children during activities
- Develop strong healthy relationships with the children during their group experience (nuture the children professionally and appropriately)
- o Model healthy communication, interactions, and choices within the group setting
- o Maintenance of required documentation and paperwork pertaining to clinical interactions. As outlined by the College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers/College of Registered Psychotherapists of Ontario.
- o Follow the code of ethics outlined by the College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers/College of Registered Psychotherapists of Ontario.

Daily Job Description:

- O Deliver nature-based therapeutic interventions for one of the following groups and themes while incorporating cultural interventions:
 - o Girl Power (self-esteem, confidence, emotions & empathy, inner critique)
 - o Boy Power (building confidence, discussing emotions, teamwork, and respect)
 - Masterminds (balanced thoughts, feelings, mindfullness techniques, gratitude, and positive affirmations)
 - Happy Hollistic (support systems, well being, relaxation, and understanding emotions and their impacts)
 - Stressbusters (identifying stress and how it shows up in our bodies, mindful breathing, anxiety, and relaxation)
 - SuperFly (self control, understanding feelings, focus, and bringing balance to your mind, body, and spirit)
- Activities are nature-based, therefore the wellness groups take place daily outdoors throughout the summer.
 - o Clinical Facilitators must be comfortable with working in the summer conditions.
